Additional Considerations

Staff

We have held meetings with all staff members to discuss all policies and risk assessments relating to COVID-19. All staff members have had the opportunity to raise concerns and ask questions.

Drop-Off

Parents will drop their children off at the designated entrance. Parents will not be allowed on site except in exceptional circumstances at the discretion of the manager on duty. In such cases their name and telephone number will be recorded for track and trace purposes. Families waiting to drop off will be asked to queue at 2m intervals.

Toilets

Toilets are allocated for the use of each bubble as far as is possible. There is one set of toiles that is shared by two bubbles. This added risk factor is mitigated by the regular cleaning of surfaces and the routine of hand sanitising at the start and end of every lesson.

Drinking Water

Students and staff will continue to bring their own water bottles.

Staffing Ratios

Beginners class (ages 5-8) one staff member for every 10 students Saturday School (ages 8-15) one staff member for every 15 students

Classrooms

Each bubble has been allocated to an indoor teaching space. There are no 'common areas'. The manager(s) on duty will use the staff room as a working space. Lessons or parts of lessons will be held outside where appropriate, weather permitting.

Equipment

Lessons will be taught with minimal equipment. Where props or accessories are

Our singing policy is as follows: Limit groups of singers to 7 students with 3m distance between the singing group and their teacher/accompanist. Group singing in spaces not smaller than 5m x 5m (or equivalent) in order to facilitate social distancing measures. When a space of this size is not available, we will teach group singing outside. When teaching singing inside, ensure the space has fresh air ventilation at all times (windows open). Singers will face the same direction or away from each other – i.e. not face-to-face. Singing teachers should wear a face mask or visor. Singers from the same family bubble need not socially distance. Where the limitations of a teaching space render these measures unachievable, teaching will be moved to our outside teaching space.
